- Evaluate programs aimed at reducing poverty around the world, using state of the art methodology (original data collection & econometric analysis)
- Regional focus: developing countries and vulnerable populations in Italy
- Thematic areas: agriculture; education; health; service delivery; access to credit, microfinance and entrepreneurship; institutions

Why create LEAP at Bocconi?

- Donors, governments and firms are increasingly required to provide evidence on the impact of their projects
- Program evaluation allows to:
 - Establish if an intervention works
 - Quantify the magnitude of the benefits
 - Compare costs & benefits and choose the intervention with the highest returns

- Italy is lagging behind compared to other countries that have created partnerships between academia & development practitioners (e.g., J-PAL, IPA, ...)
- Bocconi faculty is already active in program evaluation research in collaboration with external organizations (e.g., World Bank, BRAC, etc.)
- Bocconi students are eager to gain experience in developing countries

What LEAP plans to do

 Engage w/ policymakers (Italian cooperation, NGOs) to work together in order to improve anti-poverty programs

Two types of research

- Impact evaluation: experimental and nonexperimental methods
- Diagnosing the sources of vulnerability and poverty through rigorous empirical studies

 Disseminate the findings of our research (events, website, blog)

Involve students: small grants for fieldwork; internships w/ NGOs; contribute to blog & LEAP activities

Visiting scholars: collaborate w/ other teams
